PETITION NO. 16 OF 2025 - GRIEVANCES FOR NON-AFFILIATION OF BALOCHISTAN TAEKWONDO FEDERATION BY PAKISTAN TAEKWONDO FEDERATION

The Pakistan Sports Board (PSB) has forwarded a petition dated 25 December 2025 to the undersigned, as Adjudicator PSB Shakil Durrani (Executive Director GIK Institute and former Chief Secretary KP, AJK and Sind), received from Mr. Ali Ahmed Reki, President, Balochistan Taekwondo Association (BTA), raising charges against the office bearers of the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation (PTF) as mentioned below.

- i. The BTA alleged that the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation has denied affiliation to the Balochistan Provincial Association in defiance of the orders of 'the High Court of Balochistan in C.P. No. 374/2025 and Review Petition No. 32/2025, pursuant to which elections of the Balochistan Taekwondo Association were conducted on 01 September 2025 and the requisite notification was issued by the competent Provincial authority'. In the election held 11 out of 18 eligible participated while 3 officials of the province were present. Pakistan Taekwondo Federation does not accept this election as it disputes the eligibility of the voters.
- ii. It has further been contended that despite the above elections, the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation has not affiliated the BTA with the PTF, the national federation, and instead initiated steps for constitution of a 'management committee, which is alleged to be contrary to the Pakistan Sports Board Election Rules and applicable sports policies'.
- iii. That this action of the PTF has led to the exclusion of eligible Balochistan voters from the elections of the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation which have since been held in Jan 2026 because of disputed issues relating to elections, tenure and affiliation rules falling within the scope of adjudication under the constitution of Pakistan Sports Board, 2022.
- iv. A few irregularities have also been alleged relating to continuation of office bearers of PTF beyond the expiry of prescribed tenure and a question was raised as to how Mr. Waseem Ahmad Raja, the hitherto President of the PTF, continues to hold office for a third term when the Rules do not permit so.

The petitioner further states that to secure his rights through a CP NO 374/2025 he approached the High Court of Baluchistan for conducting elections of Baluchistan Taekwondo Association as per sports policy GOB 2008 and national sports policy 2005 under the PSB Election Rules 2022-27. The Honorable High Court ordered the Baluchistan Taekwondo Association to conduct elections as per Government sports policy and accordingly DG Sports Board of Baluchistan completed the District Taekwondo Associations election on 1st September 2025. The Sports Department of Baluchistan submitted the election report in Baluchistan High Court under CP. NO 374/2025. The High Court through Review petition No 32/2025 dated 29/10/2025 ordered issuance of the necessary notification of the winners which was done by the DG Sports Board Baluchistan. The Petitioner further states that the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation when approached for affiliation through email and letters did not issue the required affiliation. Instead, the PTF through an email on 22/12/2025 addressed to the Baluchistan Olympic Association constituted a 'management committee' for conducting Baluchistan Taekwondo Association election which the petitioner alleges is an unlawful act and a violation of PSB Election rules and law.

Clarifications and Additional information sought by Adjudicator

On the basis of the charges of the Petitioner and the response of the Respondent the Adjudicator sought six clarifications from PTF and Balochistan Taekwondo Association on issues relating to affiliation and validity of elections in order to finalise matters in compliance of the High Court orders.

- i. On what legal, constitutional, or regulatory grounds did the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation refuse to recognize the election results of the Balochistan Taekwondo Association, despite the fact that the elections were conducted under the supervision and orders of the Honourable High Court of Balochistan, in which 11 out of 18 eligible members and three authorized officials were present?
- ii. What were the specific reasons for denying or withholding affiliation to the duly elected Balochistan Taekwondo Association, and how is such a denial justified in light of the Rules and the court-mandated electoral process?
- iii. Under which provision of the PTF Constitution and Pakistan Sports Board Rules, any legal authority or notifications was a Management Committee constituted for Balochistan in place of the duly elected body? Whether, in dealing with the Balochistan Taekwondo Association, the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation complied with the Pakistan Sports Board Rules and Policy and its own Constitution? If so, specify the relevant provisions relied upon.
- iv. On what basis have the duly elected representatives of Balochistan been excluded from participation in the electoral college and elections of the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation since there is a need to justify how such exclusion is compatible under the Rules of ensuring provincial representation.
- v. Whether the actions of the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation, including non-recognition of the elected Balochistan body and constitution of a management committee, are in conformity with the orders of the Honourable High Court of Balochistan by placing on record copies of all relevant court orders and the compliance thereof.
- vi. Whether the continuation of the present office bearers of the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation beyond their prescribed constitutional tenure is lawful? And whether the rules demand a maximum of two tenures to determine whether an attempt has been made to bypass the Rules and whether a position of a chairman of the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation is even legally permissible?

Reply of the Respondent

The Respondent in his response stated that the dispute among Balochistan Taekwondo Association (BTA), Balochistan Olympic Association (BOA), and Balochistan Sports Board (BSB) has been ongoing for more than one year. On several occasions, Lt. Col. (R) Raja Wasim Ahmed, along with Mr. Murtaza Hassan Bangash and Mr. Kamran Qamar (President,

Sindh Taekwondo Association). have made 'sincere efforts to resolve the matter: how conclusive outcome could be achieved'.

The Respondent further states that as per rules and regulations, there 'are seven certified and registered provincial regions/districts eligible to participate in the elections under the supervision of the three principal stakeholders, i.e., BOA, BSB, and PTF. However, the Petitioner's party insisted that elections should only be conducted when ten to eleven districts participate'. These additional districts allegedly are neither recognized nor registered with PTF, BSB, or BOA. Further, he mentions that 'even if such districts exist, they only possess playing rights, not voting rights, as per prevailing rules, regulations, and standard practices adopted across all National Sports Federations in the country'. Due to this impasse, representatives of BOA, PTF, and the legitimate regions/districts withdrew, and the elections conducted under the Balochistan Sports Board were 'limited only three to four regions/district associations, which is not acceptable under any circumstances to PTF, BOA, or any National Sports Federation'.

The Respondent also stated that despite clear directions issued to the Balochistan Sports Board (BSB) to conduct the election in accordance with the existing seven regions affiliated with both the Balochistan Olympic Association (BOA) and PTF, this requirement was not complied with. Several district associations were either excluded or not properly represented. Complaints were subsequently received from various district associations regarding the election process, due to which the matter was referred to the POA.

The Respondent also states that it was 'pertinent to mention that the National Sports Policy and the Honourable Supreme Court of Pakistan's 2012 judgment limiting office bearers to a maximum of two tenures are being fully implemented. Elections conducted in KPK, Punjab, Islamabad, Sindh, and Gilgit- Baltistan, as well as the PTF elections held on 1st January 2026, are clear evidence of adherence to government policy and principles of good governance. These facts can be verified through the respective Provincial Sports Boards and Associations'. As the mother institution, representation from the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation (PTF) was mandatory. Despite clear directions issued to the Balochistan Sports Board (BSB) to conduct the election in accordance with the existing seven regions affiliated with both the Balochistan Olympic Association (BOA) and PTF, this requirement was not complied with. Respondent also stated that several district associations were either excluded or not properly represented. He alleged that complaints were subsequently received from various district associations regarding the election process, due to which the matter was referred to the Pakistan Olympic Association but no further action has been reported since.

Thereafter, Respondent stated that an 'emergent meeting of the General Council of the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation was held on 1st Jan 2026 at 1830 hours at Janjua Square, Plot No: 8&9, Street No:8, Block F, Gulberg Residencia, Islamabad on (physical and zoom modes) under the chairmanship of President Pakistan Taekwondo Federation. The agenda of the meeting was to initiate PTF's response regarding the rectification of the office bearers' tenure-related issue, as advised by the Pakistan Sports Board. They state that 'PTF has been strictly adhering to the tenure restrictions prescribed under the National Sports Policy 2005, which were voluntarily adopted by the Federation'. (It was alleged by the Petitioner that the specific mention of holding fresh elections to PTF was not mentioned while issuing notice for the 'emergent' meeting).

The Respondent further stated that the recent 'election (2026) has been properly conducted as per the rules of the IOC, POA, PTF and Govt of Pakistan in which executive committee on zoom and physically were present there and followed by the General Council. The minutes of the same has been circulated, press release was issued, World Taekwondo and Asian Taekwondo, along with PSB, POA were informed. As per inquiry by PSB all the documents, press release and WT, ATU letters were also sent for information'. 'Rest of the election of the complete cabinet of the NSF were also timely informed to International, POA, PSB and all affiliated units Stakeholders'. Further, he said that the election on 30 Jan 2026 was further vetted by the complete General Council where 90% were physically present and 10% on the zoom under the intimation to all concern. However, a 'reminder was also given to PSB but were not present'. He further stated that election of President, Secretary and Secretary Finance were conducted 'on the direction of Govt of Pakistan sports policy, IOC, constitution of Pakistan Taekwondo Federation, Pakistan Olympic Association and the honorable directions/ instructions of 2013'. Election of PTF 'were conducted

previous in 2022 as well on zoom in which the representative of World/Asia along with POA Representative according to IOC rules and regulation which is currently nationally as well as internationally'. The Respondent also states that as far as 'rules are concerned due to COVID 19 it was decided and vetted by 'all the organizations to take on board individuals on zoom as well and it will be authentic. Even in different courts in Pakistan and abroad most of the cases have been resolved and being discussed on zoom and it is very much verified by the honorable courts'.

He also stated that minutes of Executive Committee and General Council of 1st January 2026, where details of all individuals present on zoom as well as physically are clearly mentioned. Likewise, the details of election of 30 January 2026 of General Council meeting are attached with minutes of the conference. He also mentioned that he was 'sure that all this comprehensive reply to the respectable adjudicator will also verify the election of Pakistan Taekwondo Federation and duly support for good work being done' by them.

The Respondent in response to the clarifications sought by Adjudicator also submitted that 'through a Resolution the General Council on 30th Jan 2026 unanimously elected Col. Nabeel Ahmed Rana as President, Pakistan Taekwondo Federation, for the term 2026-2030. The President apprised the house (meaning General Council of PTF) regarding the legal, constitutional, and international obligations of Pakistan Taekwondo Federation'.

The following arguments have also been forwarded by the Respondent to the Adjudicator in their own words:

The first valid tenure of PTF commenced in 2018, as earlier years were affected due to parallelism of POA and interference of PSB. As per the Lausanne Agreement, PSB speaking orders, and Honourable High Court Orders (2015-2016), the said period could not be counted as an official tenure. No new sports policy has been officially notified by the Ministry of IPC or Pakistan Sports Board to National Sports Federations. Non-conduct of elections would result in disaffiliation cancellation of membership from Asian Taekwondo Union, World Taekwondo, and Pakistan Olympic Association.

The Respondent finally stated that the President of the PTF then invited nominations for the post of President and Wing Comd Ahmed Bilal representative of Pakistan Air Force 'endorsed' the name of Col. Nabeel Ahmed Rana and the recommendations and decisions of the Executive Committee of the PTF. The proposal was seconded by Mr Irfan Majeed, representative of Islamabad Taekwondo Association and rest of the members present both physically and via zoom. The General Council unanimously elected Col. Nabeel Ahmed Rana as President, Pakistan Taekwondo Federation, for the term 2026-2030.

Order of the Adjudicator

I have scrutinized the available record, after seeking clarifications from the parties and listening to their arguments and am of the view that legality and validity of the following two central issues need to be determined before a verdict is announced.

1) Were all the eligible electoral college voters in Balochistan invited to participate in the elections of the BTA in 2025 and were these elections held in accordance with the directions of the Balochistan High Court under the supervision of the provincial Sports Board? The number of eligible voters remains disputed between the two parties as the Petitioner claims that there are eleven regions/districts eligible to vote while the Respondent is of the view that the number is seven.

The Director General Balochistan Sports Board was spoken to on telephone by the Adjudicator and requested to offer his comments on the validity of the elections conducted under order of the Honourable High Court of Balochistan. He informed by letter (attached), that his office had re-initiated the election process so as to enable the District Taekwondo Associations to participate in the trials for selection of the team for the upcoming National Games. Taekwondo Association

The Election process commenced as scheduled in ten Districts of the said association which reported for participation in the subject election process. 'Accordingly, upon scrutinizing the (10) affiliated Districts documents produced by the members of the Districts which were issued by the District Sports officers, wherein 09 out of 10 District were allowed to participate in subject election



process'. 'The election process started among 09 Districts, but in the meanwhile the Presidents of the District Quetta, Loralai, Chaman presented an application (F/E) with averment that they would not participate in the subject election process because the said election process was against the Balochistan Taekwondo Association constitution and stated that Sports officer have no authority to organize the election in District but came merely as an observer'. As such they claimed that they are not bound to follow Sports Policy 2008 they follow and comply the only Federation and Association constitution of Taekwondo.

The letter of the DG Balochistan further added that 'keeping in view the above circumstances, the Election Committee decided that after the boycott of 03 and half Districts out of 09 Districts merely 05 and half Districts remained in election process. The Mothaida Panel obtaining (11 out of 18 votes were cast, as per policy required 07 Districts) leading the (Sports) department to officially declare it the winner. However, this decision has met with controversy. The President of the Pakistan Federation raised objections, asserting that the panel's election does not align with the established sports policy. He emphasized that they operate under their own constitution and insisted that players in the province would participate only under the governance of the Association and Federation constitution.

As for the first issue it is clear that the provincial elections were conducted by Balochistan Sports Board, a statutory administrative entity of the Government of Baluchistan, under Rules and on specific orders of the BHC. The PTF however, contends that as per rules and regulations, there 'are seven certified and registered provincial regions/districts eligible to participate in the elections under the supervision of the three principal stakeholders, i.e., BOA, BSB, and PTF. However, the Petitioner's party insists that elections should only be conducted when ten to eleven districts participate'. The authority responsible under the Rules for determining the qualifications of the eligible voters comprising the electoral college from Balochistan is the provincial Sports Board alone and it must decide how many regions/districts have been certified to participate in the elections. It is not for the national body, the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation, to decide who all should comprise the provincial electoral college. Therefore, the Petitioner's contention of lawfully representing the provincial BTA following elections conducted by BSB under orders of the Balochistan High Court is accepted. It is therefore ordered that the Balochistan Taekwondo Association as presently constituted and accepted by the Provincial Sports Department should be immediately be recognized and affiliated with the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation.

II) Should the elections conducted by the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation in Jan 2026 be deemed valid in the absence of the lawful representatives of Balochistan and should Balochistan be disenfranchised merely because the PTF did not recognize the provincial BTA on a technicality?

Regarding the second issue the PSB Rules demand that elections at the national level have to be mandated by the PSB and that its presence is required to ensure that elections are conducted in a fair and transparent manner. Importantly, without the presence of Balochistan's eligible voters, as approved by the Provincial Sports Board, the PTF is not competent to hold national level elections. Therefore, the supposed elections held in Jan 2026 by PTF are invalid and the PSB has rightfully not recognized these. It is also strange that the intimation was sent by PTF to BTA was for holding an 'emergent' meeting on 1st Jan 2026 of PTF without specifying that the real purpose of the meeting was to hold elections. Additionally, since adequate notice and time was not provided for the national elections the legality and transparency of the supposed 'elections' cannot be accepted. The absence of the representatives of the PSB to monitor the elections makes the supposed 'elections' invalid and redundant. In any case the whole province of Balochistan cannot be disenfranchised merely on the claims of one party or another. Since the essential requirements of the supposed 'elections' to PTF in January 2026 were absent these are therefore declared invalid ab initio. The PSB would need to supervise and hold open and transparent elections after ensuring that all provincial and regional eligible voters, as approved by their respective provincial bodies, are provided adequate notice to put up their candidates for elections if they desire and to ensure their presence at the time of actual voting monitored by the PSB. The contention and claims of the Respondent, the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation, on the holding of and the results of January 2026 elections are therefore rejected.



III) The Pakistan Sports Board also needs to announce its declared policy on whether voting on zoom or through proxy is permissible not only for the sport of taekwondo but for all sports and to monitor the process if deemed valid under the Rules so that complete transparency is ensured.

IV) A question arose about the continuation in office as President of PTF of one Lt Col Wasim Raja even after serving two terms which is not permissible under the Rules. The act of creating other superfluous posts like that of a Chairman PTF to accommodate through the backdoor, select personnel who have already served their authorized tenures as President, has been strictly forbidden by the PSB and such individuals be barred from the offices and the election processes as these acts infringe the Rules.

An amendment IN RULE 3(6) OF NATIONAL SPORTS FEDERATIONS (TENURE) RULES, 2025 - IMPLEMENTATION OF DECISION has also been announced by the PSB. It states that it has been observed that in several instances, office bearers, after completing their prescribed two tenures of four years each as President, continued to exercise administrative influence by assuming titles such as Chairman, Patron-in-Chief, Patron, Chief Executive Officer (CEO), or other similar positions carrying executive authority, thereby shifting administrative and financial powers from the President and Secretary General to such alternate designations. This practice effectively transfers decision-making authority to alternative positions and amounts to defeating the purpose of the National Sports Policy 2005 and the tenure limitation framework, which aims to ensure democratic rotation of leadership and prevent concentration of authority.

The Pakistan Sports Board (PSB), in its 35th Board Meeting held on 3 February 2026, reviewed the implementation status of the National Sports Policy 2005 and the National Sports Federations (Tenure) Rules, 2025. During deliberations, the Board considered the need to amend the National Sports Federations (Tenure) Rules 2025 in order to prevent circumvention of tenure restrictions through alternative designations. In this context, the Board has approved an amendment to Rule 3(6) of the National Sports Federations (Tenure) Rules, 2025. The as under (copy of amended rules attached):

The highest administrative and operation B position in the Federation shall be that of the President. The positions of Chairman, Patron-in-Chief, Patron, Chief Executive Officer (CEO), or any equivalent designation shall be ceremonial and without any administrative, financial, operational, or influential role in the Federation. All National Sports federations are requested to ensure that any position such as chairman, patron in chief, patron, CEO or any other equivalent designation other than president. If retained, shall strictly be ceremonial in nature without executive, administrative, operational or influential authority.

The Short order has been announced during the hearing and served upon the respondent and the petitioner on 26-02-2026.

5. PRESIDENT'S BRIEFING Respondent

Election of President

In accordance with the PTF Constitution approved by NOC Pakistan and Pakistan Sports Board, the President invited nominations for the post of President.

Proposal:

Wing Comd Ahmed Bilal representative of Pakistan Air Force endorsed the name of Col. Nabeel Ahmed Rana and the recommendations and decisions of the Executive Committee of the PTF.

Seconding:

The proposal was seconded by Mr Irfan Majeed, representative Islamabad Taekwondo and rest of the Members both physically and via Zoom.

Resolution:

The General Council unanimously elected Col. Nabeel Ahmed Rana as President, Pakistan Taekwondo Federation, for the term 2026-2030.

The Pakistan Taekwondo Federation Four year Tenure completed on Last week of January 2026 and National federation Election will be schedule expected on February 2026, whereas Baluchistan voters did schedule expected on February 2026, whereas Baluchistan voters did not included in electoral college and we deprived to participate election processes.

1. The required quorum was not completed during the election process.
2. Taekwondo is an Olympic sport, and therefore women's representation is mandatory; however, no women representatives were present during the election.
3. As the mother institution, representation from the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation (PTF) was mandatory. It has come to my knowledge that Faysal Bank, Civil Lines Branch, Rawalpindi, in connivance with the Pakistan Taekwondo Federation (PTF), Islamabad, has unlawfully and fraudulently utilized my CNIC and NTN to execute financial transactions amounting to PKR exceeding 101 Millions in Financial Year 2023-24 & 2024-25. I categorically state that I have no connection, knowledge, or involvement in these transactions, nor I had ever been informed or intimidated by either party in this regard. Shockingly, this unlawful misuse of my credentials has not been confined to the recent past but has been a recurring practice over previous years. 4. Upon learning of this issue, I lodged a formal complaint with the President of Pakistan Taekwondo

Federation on 09-02-2024 who subsequently issued a letter to the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) in this regard. Despite considerable time having passed, no action has materialized. I now stand unjustly entangled in a matter not of my making, arising from the fraudulent misuse of my CNIC/NTN by a National-level Bank and a National Sports Federation.
